Re: High School Assessment Update

Dear Dr. Lussier,
I am pleased to join our colleagues Dr. Keough, Julie Trask, and Karen Archambault on Tuesday, January 14 to present this year's High School Assessment data. The High School team has broadened the scope of this year's presentation to include information from the ACT and AP assessments, in addition to the SAT data they have presented in years past. As in the past, Wellesley High School students have fared well, with among the highest SAT scores in the state, with steady gains among our minority student groups on the SAT and ACT tests.

SAT Highlights: Of particular note is our improvement in narrowing the achievement gap over four years among Hispanic and African American students, with gains of 109 and 172 points respectively on the SAT.

ACT Highlights: Wellesley High School students outscore the national average by seven points, and outscore other Massachusetts students by 5.9 points. Hispanic students have reversed the achievement gap on the ACT test, while other student groups have remained steady.

AP Highlights: Wellesley continues to outscore the global average of AP test takers by $30 \%$ points, with $91 \%$ (vs. $61 \%$ ) of students receiving a 3 or above. Wellesley also outscores other Massachusetts students by $18 \%$ points. In addition, $100 \%$ of Wellesley students taking English and Foreign Language exams received a 3 or higher, while $98 \%$ did so in Science/Technology. There was a slight decline in the percentage of students receiving a 3 or above in Math/Computer Science and in Social Sciences.

We look forward to presenting this data on Tuesday in greater detail and to hear your questions and comments.
