

Family Timeframe & Participants


- Friday, July 3 to Friday, July 10
- 2,754 parent/guardian responses
 - \circ PreK-2 = 929 (of \cong 1100 students)
 - \circ 3-5 = 943 (of \cong 1100 students)
 - \circ WMS = 975 (of \cong 1200 students)
 - \circ WHS = 1111 (of \cong 1500 students)

Staff Timeframe & Participants

- Educators: Monday, July 6 to Monday, July 13
- 733 educator responses (58% were teachers)
 - PreK = 44
 - \circ K-5 = 328
 - o 6-8 = 157
 - o 9-12 = 198
 - \circ PreK-12 = 26


Families: Learning Model Options

Families would enroll in full in-person and hybrid models at similar rates.




At every level, about 1 in 6 families had a medical need for a full remote model.

Medical Need for Remote





More families preferred a within week hybrid over a by the week hybrid model.





Families: Transportation

WMS and WHS families will need bus transport more than PreK-5 families.










Families: Before & After School Care

24% of PreK-2 families and 16% of Gr. 3-5 families would like after care.








Families: Meals in School

Percent of families buying most meals through WFS increased by level, from 8% to 18%.



Educators: Thoughts on Returning


2 in 3 educators can return in person. 1 in 4 educators require childcare.

Returning Plans




3 in 5 educators are nervous about returning.

WPS safety protocols was a factor for nearly half of educators.


Main Decision Influences



Educators: Remote and Hybrid Models


In a full remote model, educators overwhelmingly rated synchronous experiences as most valuable.

Valuable Components of Full Remote




Educators rated by the week and within week hybrid models similarly.

In the hybrid model, educators slightly preferred including synchronous experiences for student learning at home


Hybrid Learning at Home



Educators: Needs and Concerns


Educators rated remote learning aspects and anti-racism education as PD needs.

Professional Development Needs




Most educators would find increased tech support useful.

Tech Support




The majority of educators had high levels of personal concerns about this fall.
