

Methods


- Full In Person Feedback
 - Google Forms survey
 - Parents/guardians, secondary students, and staff
 - o 22 aspects related to full in person: concerned or reassured
 - Available in English, Simplified Chinese, and Spanish
 - Anonymous
 - o March 15-18
- Transfer Requests
 - PowerSchool form
 - Parents/guardians
 - Available in English, Simplified Chinese, and Spanish
 - o March 19-24

Full, In-Person Feedback Respondents


- 1,999 parents/guardians of 3,430 students (77% of student body)
 - o 29 PAWS students (out of 84 total, 35%)
 - 1,401 elementary students (out of 1,808 total, 77%)
 - o 1998 secondary students (out of 2,539 total, 79%)
- 850 secondary students (33%)
- 459 in-person staff members (out of 921, 50%)
 - 20 administrators
 - 265 teachers
 - 134 other mainly student-facing staff
 - 31 other mainly not student-facing staff
 - Additionally, 16 RLS staff members responded

Parent/Guardian Feedback

32% of in-person parents/guardians were concerned about learning continuity during quarantine.



86% of remote parents/guardians were concerned about in-school transmission and number of close contacts.












In person staff were most concerned about distance at lunch and demand on teachers.

- Distance during lunch
- Number of close contacts

Addt'l Top Sources of Concern

- Learning during quarantine (p/g)
- Changing routines (students)
- Demand on teachers (p/g, staff)
