RE: Enrollment Report and Projection

#### **Background:**

The school year 2021-2022 enrollment report is divided into three sections. The first section provides the October 1 enrollment data in terms of historical information, as well as, actual versus projected. The second section provides enrollment projections and related methodologies. The third section provides class size information for the Middle and High Schools.

#### **Review of School Year 2021-2022 Enrollment Projection Models:**

The pandemic had a significant impact on enrollment in SY'20-21. Enrollment between October 2019 and October 2020 saw a reduction of 396 students while the actual enrollment was 329 students below projected levels. In October 2020, the district created two projection models: typical and modified. Below is a brief explanation of the differences in the models:

1. Model 1 (Typical): The district utilized the 5-year age 4 to kindergarten ratio gathered through the annual Town census. The 5-year cohort survival methodology was used to develop a projection for each grade level (1 – 12) by school. Using this typical methodology, the school year 2021-2022 projected enrollment was 4,233 or a reduction of 129 students.

Delta between Model 1 (Typical) and Actual October 1, 2021:

47 Student Variance

2. Model 2 (Modified): Using the school year 2020-2021 projection developed in October 2019 (kindergarten to Grade 5) as the base (rather than the actual), apply the 5-year progression ratios. Grades 6 through 12 continued to use the "typical" approach in the projection model. Using this modified methodology, the school year 2021-2022 projected enrollment was 4,457 or an increase of 107 students.

Delta between Model 2 (Modified) and Actual October 1, 2021:

271 Student Variance

In October 2020, we anticipated our enrollment would rebound if the virus were more controlled this year and if we could offer in-person options for students. Since current enrollment is often the basis for predicting future enrollment, we reached out to Tracy Healy, President of FutureThink, to validate our approach to a modified projection model for school year 2021-2022. Ms. Healy acknowledge the challenges school year 2019-2020 had created given the loss of students in public schools across the country. Based on these conversations, the district chose to use Model 2 (modified)

for the Kindergarten through Grade 5 projections. The Model 2 (modified) over-projected the enrollment for school year 2021-2022.

#### **Enrollment Summary:**

The in-district enrollment including resident and non-resident students, but excluding pre-school students, is 4,186 as of October 1, 2021. Below is a summary of the enrollment Kindergarten to Grade 12 comparing October 2020 to October 2021 data:

The current year data reflects a reduction of 176 students on a year-to-year basis.

This report contains several tables that are included in the Appendix. Each table is referenced below, and a summary of the data is included.

#### Section I: Enrollment and October 1 Data

#### Table A: K-12 Enrollment Report (Page 12)

Overall, the enrollment is two-hundred seventy-one (271) students below the Wellesley Public Schools projection or a 6.1% variance. Significant variances exist at the elementary grades and Grade 9. This table includes resident and non-resident students.

In January 2020, the district engaged the services of Future Think to develop an updated 10-year enrollment projection. The following is a comparison of the district's current enrollment to the FutureThink<sup>1</sup> projection for school year 2021-2022. Below is a summary of the variances:

#### Table B: Enrollment – All Students (Page 13)

In addition to the 4,186 Kindergarten to Grade 12 students, there are an additional 251 resident students serviced by Wellesley Public Schools. These include eleven (11) resident students, who have an Individual Education Program (IEP), beyond grade 12. There are 94 pre-school aged children enrolled in PAWS, or Pre-School at Wellesley Schools. In addition, there were 56 resident students aged 3 – 22 years of age who are placed in an out of district placement (day or residential). Resident students who attend private or parochial schools and are eligible for an Individual Education Program (IEP), may receive services through WPS. Currently, there are 90 private/parochial school resident children in this category. When taking all students into consideration, the total enrollment in Wellesley Public Schools is 4,437 students.


On an annual basis, the district prepares and submits the School Attending Report<sup>2</sup> to the Massachusetts Department of Elementary and Secondary Education (MA DESE). This report cross-references the town census data with the school student information system to determine the number of students who are school aged and do not attend Wellesley Public Schools. Below is a summary of the last ten (10 years):

Between January 2020 and January 2021, there were two shifts worth noting: homeschool and private/parochial. In January 2021, the district reported an increase of 62 students who opted for homeschooling during the pandemic. In January 2020, the district reported 12 students. This increased to 74 in January 2021. In January 2021, the district reported an increase of 40 students who opted for private/parochial education. In January 2020, the district reported 1,190 students. This increased to 1,230 in January 2021.

Below is a chart showing the percent of Wellesley resident children who have opted an educational setting outside of Wellesley Public Schools:



Historically, the percent of students in private and parochial settings has ranged from 18% - 20%. During COVID, the percentages increased to 22.6% or 40 students.

#### Table C: Elementary Classroom Configurations as of October 1, 2021 (Page 14)

As of October 1, 2021, there were 1,782 students in Kindergarten through Grade 5. Grade level guidelines for kindergarten to Grade 2 are 18 to 22 students per section and for Grade 3 to Grade 5 are 22 to 24 students per section. Balancing sections across seven (7) neighborhood elementary schools is challenging.

Districtwide average class size data (total enrollment / total number of sections) for Kindergarten through Grade 2 are below class size guidelines (16.9 to 17.9). Grades 2 through 5 are below class size guidelines (17.1 to 18.8) with no exceptions. Table C provides the class sizes for each grade by elementary school.

As of October 1<sup>st</sup>, no sections are over guideline; seventy-four (74) sections are under guideline (73.3%); and twenty-seven (27) sections are within guideline (26.7%). In school year 2021-2022, Hardy (one classroom) and Upham (one classrooms) have two teachers who share the classroom teacher role. These job shares are the reason for the 103 teachers for 101 classroom sections.

This year, five grade levels at three schools were closed to new enrollments.

Due to the declining enrollment at the Upham Elementary School, the School Committee voted a change to policy JG: Student Enrollment and School Assignment (effective June 2, 2021). In summary, the following changes were implemented to increase the number of students attending Upham by closing sections at other schools before the maximum class size guideline were reached. The impact of the policy change is summarized below:

- Newly enrollment Kindergarten and Grade 1 students currently zoned to Bates and Sprague are reassigned to Upham.
- Open enrollment was re-opened specifically for Upham School allowing families to opt-into Upham on or before August 1, 2021.

The School Committee will revisit these policy changes each year until redistricting occurs. Below is a summary of the number of families and students impacted by this policy change. In addition, there was 1 family/1 student who opted to open-enroll to Upham through this policy change. The policy changes implemented by the School Committee in June 2021 resulted in an additional 5 students at the Upham Elementary School.

#### **Table D: Enrollment Cohort Movement (18 Years) (Page 15)**

Tracking the movement of student cohorts from one grade to the next (i.e., Grade 1 in SY'20-21 to Grade 2 in SY'21-22) over time provides historical in and out migration. Migration can be a result of family moves and /or enrollment changes related to homeschooling, parochial, public, and private school choice. The report provides the cohort movements by grade for the past eighteen (18) years. The ratios developed through this review are used as part of the projection model for Grades 1 through 12. For the school year 2022-2023, the district used the five-year cohort ratio for the age 4 to kindergarten and for the Grade 1 through Grade 12 enrollment projection.

#### Table E: District Projection versus Actual Enrollment by Level (28 Years) (Page 16)

Developing an accurate enrollment projection is challenging. There are many factors that can influence the model: availability and prices of properties; number of affordable housing units; parental choice of education (public, private, parochial, homeschooling); etc.

Table E provides the variances by level between projected and actual enrollment by level. The elementary level experienced the greatest variance from projection at (-11.08%) or 222 students below projection.

#### Table F: District Projection versus Actual Elementary Enrollment by School (20 Years) (Page 17)

Actual enrollment as of October 1st at the elementary schools was 222 students below the projection. The variance is comprised of:

#### Table G: Year Over Year Change Enrollment by Level (30 Years) (Page 19)

All levels experienced a reduction in enrollment over last year. The middle school level experienced the largest reduction at 81 students. The elementary and high school both experienced reductions to overall enrollment of 28 students and 67 students, respectively. Overall, there are 176 fewer students enrolled in Kindergarten through Grade 12 compared to the same time last year. This represents an overall reduction of -4.2%.

#### Table H: Year Over Year Change Enrollment by Elementary School (21 Years) (Page 20)

Elementary enrollment experienced a reduction of 28 students or -1.5%. Most elementary schools experienced a reduction in enrollment: Bates (1 student); Hardy (11 students); Hunnewell (10 Students); Schofield (1 Student); and Sprague (14 students). Fiske and Upham Elementary Schools experienced an increase in enrollment of 1 and 8 respectively.

In the past ten years, enrollment across all seven elementary schools has resulted in a reduction of 570 students.

#### **Section II: Enrollment Projection**

The projection models for Kindergarten and Grades 1 through Grade 12 differ slightly. The kindergarten model is based on town census data of resident children from birth through age five. An age 4 to kindergarten ratio is developed annually for each school attendance zone. The cohort survival methodology is used to develop the Grade 1 through Grade 12 projection. The Massachusetts School Building Authority (MSBA) defines the cohort survival methodology as: Historic enrollment data is used to calculate average grade-to-grade survival ratios (the proportion of students enrolled in one grade and school year to the number of students enrolled in the next grade and school year) to project the number of students in each grade.

<u>Kindergarten Enrollment Projection</u>: Annual census data is used by the district to track the number of resident children living in each school attendance zone (birth through high school). Changes in the number of resident children aged four in the previous year to current year kindergarten enrollment by school is used to create a cohort survival ratio. Ratios are developed for 3-year, 5-year and 10-year intervals. The five-year ratio is used to develop a school-by-school kindergarten enrollment projection. According to the Massachusetts Department of Public Health (MA DPH), there were 165 Wellesley resident births in 2017, five years prior to the anticipated enrollment in kindergarten for school year 2022-2023.

The current Town of Wellesley census data reflects 222 age 4 resident children across the seven elementary attendance zones. As with prior years, the district will base the projection on the Town's census data rather than the MA DPH birth data. Example: Bates attendance zone has 40 children, reported on the 2021 Town Census, who are four (4) years of age. The five-year ratio of 4-year-old children in the previous year attending kindergarten in the current year is 1.09 (109% of four-year old in the Bates attendance zone attend Bates Kindergarten in the following school year). Below is the calculation used to generate the kindergarten projection by school attendance zone:

For the purposes of this projection, the district is utilizing the 5-year age 4 to kindergarten ratio. This results in an overall kindergarten enrollment projection of 259 students.

<u>Grade 1 through Grade 12 Enrollment Projection:</u> Using the cohort survival methodology, a projection is developed for each grade level (1 - 12) by school. The cohort survival methodology is used to create three ratios: 3-year, 5-year, and 10-year. Based on historical projection to actual variances, the district chose to use the 5-year ratio for the school year 2022-2023 projections. Below are the ratios used in the projection methodology.

Example: Hunnewell Kindergarten (SY'21-22) has an enrollment of 34 students. Over the past five (5) years, Hunnewell has experienced 1.06% of enrolled Kindergarten students attend Grade 1 in the following year. Below is the calculation used to generate the Grade 1 projection by school attendance zone:

Example: Wellesley Middle School Grade 7 (SY'21-22) has an enrollment of 323 students. Over the past five (5) years, Wellesley Middle School has experienced 99% of enrolled Grade 7 students attend Grade 8 in the following year. Below is the calculation used to generate the Grade 8 projection:

These ratios result in an overall enrollment projection of 941 middle school students (Grade 6 through Grade 8) and 1,412 high school students (Grade 9 through Grade 12) for school year 2022-2023.

### Table I: Elementary School by School Enrollments: Actual (2008-09 through 2020-21) and Projection (2021-22 through 2024-25) (Page 22)

These tables provide the historical and projected enrollment for each elementary school by grade. Each elementary school has six ratios — one for each grade kindergarten through grade 5. The ratios, as previously noted, are developed by tracking historical cohort movements based on resident birth data by school attendance zone. All grade level projections are based on the 5-year progression ratio.

Table J: Enrollment History (2008-09 through 2021-22) and Projection (2022-23 through 2025-26) (Page 25)

The kindergarten to grade 12 enrollment projections for the 2022-2023 school year is 4,060 students. Below is a summary of the expected changes by grade level:

#### Table K: SY21-22 Range of Class Size by Department (WHS)

In SY'21-22, the High School is offering 455 full year and semester 1 courses. Of these courses, forty percent (40%) are at or above class size guidelines. On a historical basis, the High School class size data by department has been consistent through school year 2019-2020 with a decline last year with a slight rebound this year.

In SY'21-22, the Middle School is offering 407 full year and semester 1 courses. On average, nine percent (9%) of these classes are at or above class size guidelines. On a historical basis, the Middle School class size data by department has been consistent through school year 2019-2020 with a lower than historical averages for the past two years.

#### **Summary**

In summary, the school year 2021-2022 enrollments reflect an overall reduction in the number of students attending Wellesley Public Schools of 176 students.

The school year 2022-2023 enrollment projection is 4,060 students in kindergarten through Grade 12. This represents an expected decrease of 126 students from the October 1, 2021, count. I look forward to discussing this with you and providing additional information as needed. Thank you.


